This year was filled with big changes, transitions and renewed focus at the Corner. Since being named Executive Director in December 2017, I have dedicated all my energy and focus to building the future of the Corner. I am very lucky to be working with our amazing staff and board leaders, and of course all of you who provide essential support to the youth we serve.

You will see in this report the volume of services we provided this year to a very diverse population facing many challenges to good health. I'd like to share with you one of our new initiatives, the **Corner Ambassador Program**. The goal of this program is to work with a wide range of community members to help ensure that area youth know about key issues that impact their health, and the related services that are available at the Corner. In line with the Corner's tradition of peer education, this program focuses on training youth in our patient age range to deliver this message with a focus on sexually transmitted infections, suicide prevention and opioid use, all growing concerns. We thank Washtenaw County, the Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan, and United Way of Washtenaw County for their support of this initiative.

The Corner is blessed to be supported by big-hearted and generous staff, and you, our donors and community partners. Together, we share a vision to give youth a healthy start by delivering valuable services, meaningful programs, and quality health care that is accessible to all who are ages 12 to 25. As underserved youth face an increase in unmet health needs, we are resolved to providing outstanding care that will address the health disparities they experience, dictated by multiple social determinants of health.

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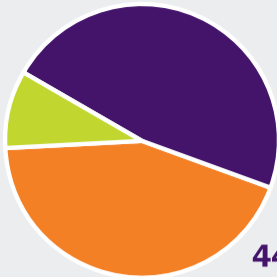

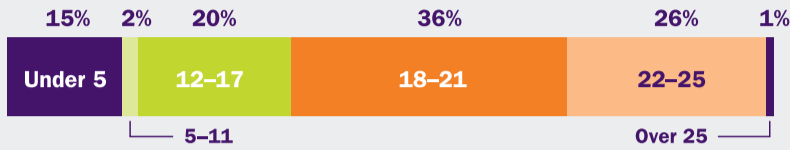

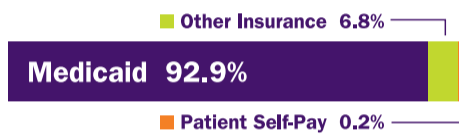

Corner Programs and Outreach

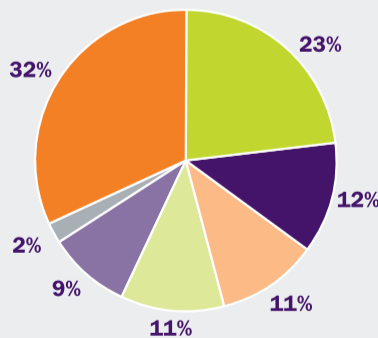
The Corner hosted over **ten graduate-level interns** from University of Michigan (UM) School of Social Work and School of Public Health and East Michigan University (EMU) Women's and Gender Studies and Health Education programs. The Corner hosted over **20 undergraduates interns** from UM Future Public Health Leaders Program, UM Summer Enrichment Program, EMU's Health Administration, Sociology, Social Work, and Non Profit Management programs. Two of these undergraduates left our program to accept job offers from larger health systems.

The **Corner Theatre Troupe** provided 220 hours of trainings, rehearsals, and performance opportunities to 21 young artists. These trainings and rehearsals prepared the young artists to provide 61 live performances and 48 follow-up workshops for 1,838 audience members.

The **Corner Store** gave out 10,253 pounds of food to 522 individuals with an average household of 3 members; and clothing and household items to 246 individuals, averaging 43 individuals each month.

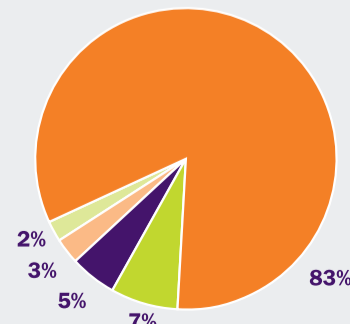
