2023 Highlights

- ▶ In partnership with Kiwanis International Club of Ann Arbor, The Corner Health Center's **Behavioral Health team** was awarded funding so each team member could be trained to provide EMDR therapy, a game-changer for patients with trauma. In addition, our **MIHP social workers** have received specialty training in EMDR and perinatal mood and anxiety disorder treatment, allowing us to better serve our patients' specific mental health needs.
- ▶ The Corner has fostered youth leadership in multiple ways this past year. Our **Theatre Troupe** put on 6 performances to 247 audience members to destigmatize mental health and promote healthy relationships. Our **Youth Leadership Council** presented at 3 conferences, facilitating workshops to nearly a thousand attendees advocating for youth in health spaces.
- ▶ As part of The Corner's commitment to our justice system-involved young people, we have developed our new and exciting **Specialized Alternative to Sentencing Support (S.A.S.S.) program**. This program is Michigan's first diversion program for young caregivers based in a healthcare center!
- ▶ A number of perinatal patients and **Maternal Infant Health** clients have gone on to receive additional supports at The Corner, including **doula services**. The Corner re-started the doula program post-pandemic in late 2023, hired 1 new doula and trained 2 employees! Our doulas were present for multiple births in 2023.

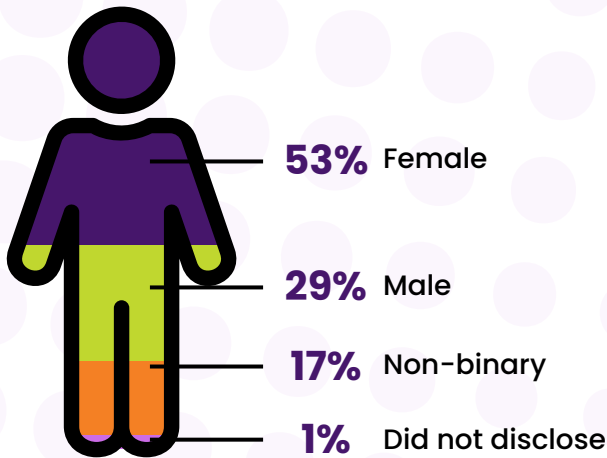

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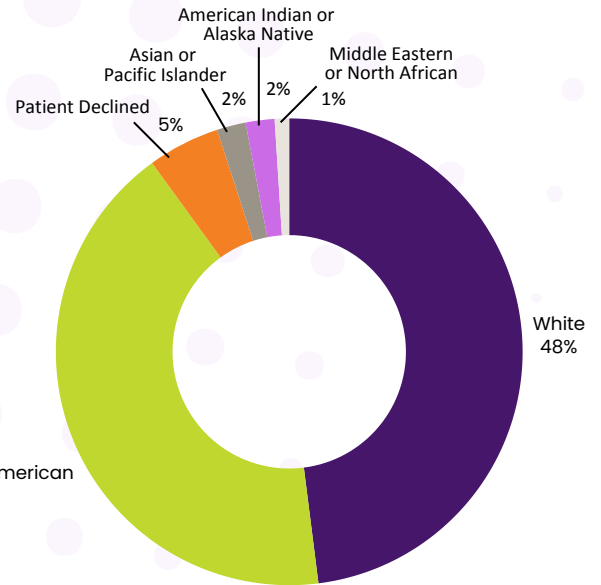

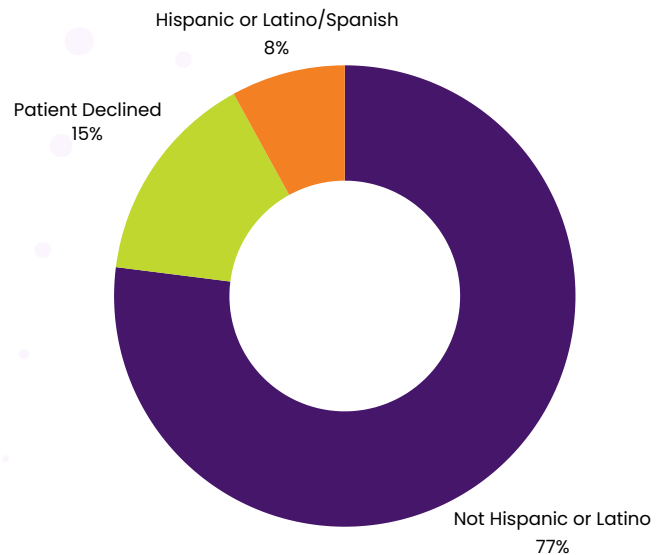
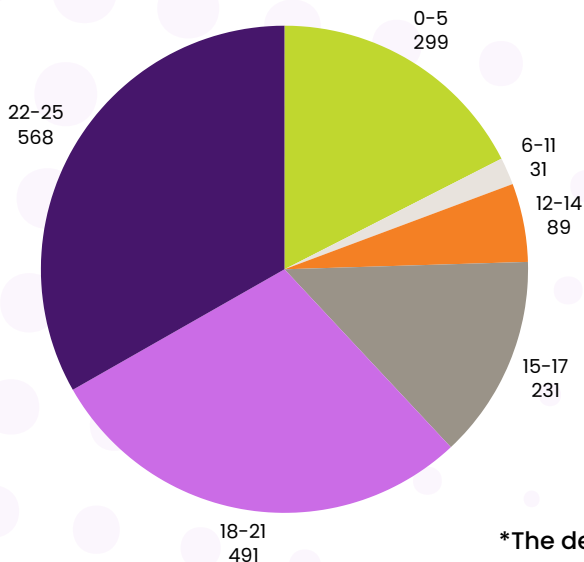
Patient served identified as...

The Corner has been caring for a young transman for years. Put in a difficult situation with limited parental involvement, by the time he was a teenager he began to use opiates. A family friend invited him to come live in Washtenaw County, and our patient's road to recovery began: enrolling at WAVE, the virtual school program near us, and establishing a care relationship with The Corner. This young person came in for a recent check-up and is overcoming addiction and on the road to a healthier future. **The Corner plays such a vital role in the lives of our patients**, no matter their background.



Stay up-to-date on all of our programming updates



A patient came to The Corner Health Center relatively late in her pregnancy. Despite a limited timeframe, our **Maternal Infant Health team** was able to quickly provide her with needed supports and services, including childbirth education, mental health treatment, and doula services, allowing her to feel prepared for childbirth and parenting. She repeatedly expresses her "gratitude" and "appreciation" for our support and for the welcoming environment that she's found here. Our MIHP served over one hundred patients in 2023.

So excited with the meeting, the young father offered to keep Darryl there to discuss fatherhood longer and even committed to a future social meeting with other young fathers to connect and gain perspective. Our Fathers for Family program has served 40 young men.



Stay up-to-date on all of our programming updates



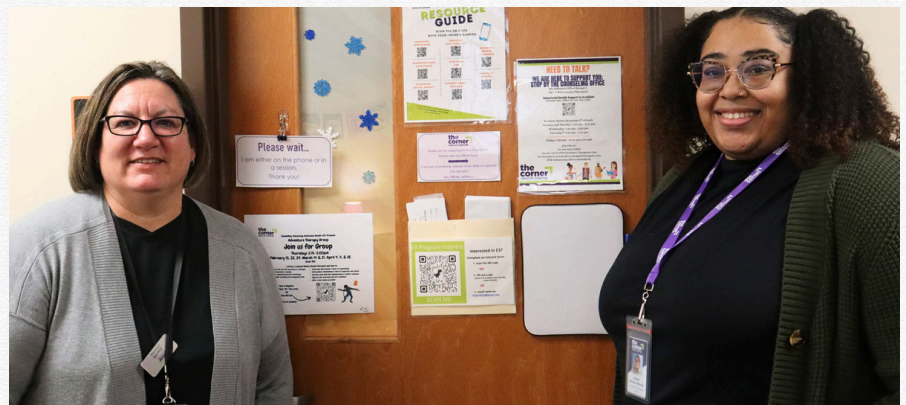

So many students had questions and misconceptions about mental health, therapy, and seeking help when you need it.
